In one year alone...

- Arts and cultural production in South Carolina added 2.9% or \$9.4 billion to the state's economy.
- South Carolina's arts and cultural industries employed 67,784 workers. These workers earned wages and benefits totaling \$4.6 billion.
- 39.7% of South Carolina's adults attended live music, theater, or dance performances, while 19.4% attended art exhibits.
