In one year alone...

- Arts and cultural production in Montana added 3.3% or \$2.4 billion to the state's economy.
- Montana's arts and cultural industries employed 20,269 workers. These workers earned wages and benefits totaling \$1.3 billion.
- 47.1% of Montana's adults attended live music, theater, or dance performances, while 22.5% attended art exhibits.

The **Blue Star Museums** program provided free admission to thousands of active military personnel and their families at 34 participating museums in Montana.

More than 2,723 students from 129 high schools in Montana participated in Poetry Out Loud.

The NEA Big Read program generated community events focused on reading outstanding American literature and involving more than 26,321 adults and students in Montana.



The Shakespeare in American Communities program in Montana enabled schools to offer 10,957 children the opportunity to see live professional performances of Shakespeare, or to engage in educational programs.
