- Arts and cultural production in New York added 7.6% or \$164.7 billion to the state's economy.
- New York's arts and cultural industries employed 482,543 workers. These workers earned wages and benefits totaling \$66.1 billion.
- 26.7% of New York's adults attended live music, theater, or dance performances, while 13.9% attended art exhibits.
