Some applicants to the Arts Endowment may benefit from enhanced technical assistance resources









- Our Town Program <u>OR</u>
- Research Grants Program

*Note: All applicants must also meet the general Arts Endowment eligibility requirements related to tax-exempt status, programming history, and reporting requirements.

Compliance Requirements

Accessibility

• All projects must be both programmatically and physically accessible to individuals with disabilities in accordance with federal law including ADA and Section 504.

Non-discrimination

 Applications may focus on a particular group or demographic; however, they may not be exclusionary under Federal civil rights laws and policies prohibiting discrimination. This extends to hiring practices, artist selection processes, and audience engagement.

National Historic Preservation Act & National Environmental Protection Act

Additional staff review for projects that take place:

- Inside/near a historic site
- Outdoors

Funding Amounts

Grants are all \$10,000

Example: \$10,000 NEA Request \$10,000 Cost share/match \$20,000 Project costs

Sources may include: private foundations, individual donations, ticket sales, and in-kind sources, among others

Funds **do not** need to be committed at the time of application

Application Review: Artistic Excellence Criteria

Artistic Excellence

The quality of the artists and other key individuals, creative process, works of art, organizations, arts education providers, artistic partners, and/or services that the project will involve and their relevance to the audience or communities being served.



Application Review: Artistic Merit Criteria

The ability of the project to reach and meaningfully engage with underserved groups/communities —those whose opportunities to experience the arts are limited relative to: geography, ethnicity, economics, or disability.

The value and appropriateness of the project to the organization's mission, artistic field, artists, audience, community, and/or constituency.



Application Review: Artistic Merit Criteria


The ability to carry out the project based on such factors as the appropriateness of the budget, clarity of the project activities, the resources involved, and the qualifications of the project's personnel and/or partnerships.

Clearly defined goals and/or proposed outcomes and an appropriate plan to determine if those goals and/or proposed outcomes are met. As applicable:

Potential to strengthen the arts sector through knowledge-sharing and resources.
Potential to make quality arts or cultural resources more widely available.
Potential of the project to grow organizational capacity and experience.

NEA reviewers are recruited from diverse geographic areas all across the country. Your response here will help to familiarize reviewers with your organization and situate your project within the framework of your organization and community, as well as help reviewers consider aspects of your project's artistic excellence and artistic merit, such as its relevance and appropriateness to your constituency.



Tips

Financial need is not part of the review criteria.

A good plan > good idea

Applications are awarded on a competitive basis.

Reach out to staff before the deadline
