Purpose: To support a series of studies to develop best practices for the use of well-being metrics in the design and evaluation of arts projects that seek to improve community outcomes.

Additional Project Description: The research will combine analysis of survey data from several large-scale U.S. surveys including questions on arts participation and/or the self-reported well-being of individuals. The data will derive from sources such as the National Endowment for the Arts' Survey for Public Participation in the Arts, the American Time Use Survey, the General Social Survey, and Gallup data on subjective well-being. Researchers also will conduct a review of extant literature and programs on well-being interventions grounded in the arts. This knowledge will be used to guide the evaluation of a micro-grants program supporting projects that include an arts component and a focus on advancing equity, inclusion, and overall well-being. The evaluation, which will generate a toolkit for well-being measurement in the arts, will be conducted in partnership with Civic Wellbeing Partners, the sponsoring organization of the micro-grants.

Intended Beneficiaries: The project has the potential to benefit researchers, practitioners, and policymakers.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Grant Amount: \$75,000

Purpose: To support a randomized, waitlist-controlled study examining the effects of improvisational (improv) theater games and cognitive behavioral therapy on the social well-being of youth with anxiety and depression.

Additional Project Description: Youth with anxiety and depression will be randomly assigned to three groups: an improv-only intervention, an improv-plus cognitive behavioral therapy intervention, or a waitlist group. Analyses will include comparisons of pre-, post-, and follow-up assessments measuring factors such as self-reported anxiety, depression, satisfaction with the intervention, peer connectedness, emotion regulation, experiences with discrimination, and attitudes toward the psychological treatment. Parental reports of anxiety and depression also will be collected.

Intended Beneficiaries: The project has the potential to benefit youth with anxiety and depression, their parents, and various stakeholders such as cognitive psychologists, drama therapists, and theater organizations.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

City Lore, Inc.

Grant Amount: \$20,000

Purpose: To support a qualitative study exploring the resilience of organizations with arts programming that are excluded from the arts philanthropic support system.

Additional Project Description: The project will address research questions about the resilience of arts and cultural providers such as social clubs, religious institutions, and small businesses during times of crisis, with a focus on the periods before, during, and after the COVID-19 pandemic. Working with folklorists, the researchers will conduct interviews and surveys with leaders from "community anchor" organizations in Atlanta, Georgia; Miami, Florida; New York City, New York; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and Seattle, Washington. Research questions will include: 1) how have community anchors used arts and culture to help ease the psychological trauma of the COVID-19 pandemic and to build community resilience for future crises?; 2) how can fostering community-based cultural practices promote cultural equity and improve the quality of life of neighborhoods and communities, particularly during crises?; and 3) how can community anchors be better connected with resources and support systems in adjacent sectors?

Intended Beneficiaries: The project has the potential to benefit public as well as private funders of the arts and community developers.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Cornell University

Grant Amount: \$75,000

Purpose: To support a mixed-methods study of student outcomes of an environmental education curriculum that uses art-based, immersive, and interdisciplinary teaching methods.

Additional Project Description: Researchers will assess the integration of the arts in teaching and learning about environmental issues through an outdoor "field school" approach. The study will compare learning outcomes for college students who participate in the arts integration program with those of students who receive instruction on environmental issues only from a traditional environmental course. Researchers will use surveys, interviews, and focus groups to examine academic performance and achievement through student exams, papers, projects, exhibitions, and artworks, as well as through performance assessments. The field school component will involve visiting and studying various New York sites with significant artistic and ecological impacts, such as museums and parks.

Intended Beneficiaries: The project has the potential to benefit environmental educators and Cornell University students, and have a positive impact on arts-based curricula and teaching methods for environmental education.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Medical University of South Carolina

Charleston, SC

Grant Amount: \$85,000

Purpose: To support a randomized clinical trial examining the effects of art therapy combined with physical therapy for children undergoing bone marrow transplants.

Additional Project Description: Children undergoing a bone marrow cell transplant will be randomly assigned to two groups: a collaborative art therapy and physical therapy intervention, or a physical therapy-only intervention. Each group will engage in daily art therapy and/or physical therapy for two weeks. Analyses will include comparing pre-test and post-test assessments of self-care, mobility, cardiovascular health, and mood and emotional changes to examine whether art therapy plus physical therapy yields a significant improvement in all outcome variables, compared with the effects of physical therapy alone.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has potential to benefit art therapists and physical therapists, and patients, families, and practitioners involved in pediatric transplant medicine.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

MetroHealth System

Grant Amount: \$85,000

Purpose: To support a quasi-experimental impact evaluation of an arts-based prevention program promoting resiliency and stress responsiveness among teens who have experienced community or personal trauma.

Additional Project Description: Working in Cleveland public high schools, researchers will evaluate the SAFE (Students Are Free to Express) Project, an arts-based prevention curriculum. The program brings professional teaching artists into the classroom, integrating a variety of arts disciplines and media with the curriculum to help address students' social and emotional needs. Pre- and post-intervention, the arts program participants will be compared with non-participants on self-reported assessments of hope, general resilience, stress, social support, empathy, and emotion regulation.

Intended Beneficiaries: The project has the potential to benefit teens and schools and organizations seeking to implement arts-based strategies or curricula for preventing stress and promoting resilience among disadvantaged youth.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Grant Amount: \$30,000

Purpose: To support a study examining relationships between schools and arts partner organizations participating in a collective impact arts education project.

Additional Project Description: Researchers with the Austin Independent School District and the University of Texas at Austin will conduct a mixed-methods, single-case embedded study of the Creative Learning Initiative, the city's collective impact program in arts education, to answer the following primary research questions: 1) what are the ways arts partners combine program types in the initiative, and how do these programmatic combinations relate to perceptions of organizations' growth, sustainability, or strategic impact after a period of time?; and 2) to what extent do these perceptions align with evidence of network change and impact? Researchers will perform quantitative network analysis and qualitative data analysis. The study results will help arts organizations and schools to coordinate and collaborate more effectively in arts education programming.

Intended Beneficiaries: The study has the potential to benefit arts educators, schools, and arts organizations pursuing and evaluating collective impact strategies in arts education.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Ohio State University

Grant Amount: \$30,000

Purpose: To support a longitudinal qualitative study exploring both the struggles and creative resilience of working artists throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additional Project Description: Researchers will conduct follow-up interviews with artists from a wide range of artistic fields who were initially interviewed in the first year of the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as conduct new interviews with additional artists. In these interviews, researchers will oversample artists of color and artists at risk of ending their artistic careers because of situational or structural impediments, such as economic or labor market concerns or caregiving responsibilities. The researchers will systematically analyze the interview data, publish and disseminate the findings, and host a national symposium on the impact of COVID-19 on artists.

Intended Beneficiaries: The project has the potential to benefit arts administrators and funders by improving their understanding of artist labor market challenges and opportunities.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Providence College

Grant Amount: \$15,000

Purpose: To conduct an ethnographic study of arts and cultural responses during different stages of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additional Project Description: Working with several community partners, including the creative incubator AS220 and the Providence Department of Arts, Culture + Tourism, the researchers will use photography and stories to illustrate and examine 1) the role of arts and artists in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic in the city of Providence; 2) how the identities and responsibilities of artists and community leaders have changed after a period of time in response to different waves of the pandemic; and 3) how the arts can help communities to re-imagine the future. Methods will include in-depth interviews with local artists and policy experts, a systematic collection of media reports and official sources, and observations from two public-dialogue meetings.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has the potential to benefit primarily community arts organizations and civic leaders in Providence, Rhode Island, and throughout the state.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey

Grant Amount: \$60,000

Purpose: To support an ethnographic case study of the role of hip-hop-based arts education in facilitating youth community-building, agency, and activism.

Additional Project Description: This study will investigate cohorts of youth leaders of color who participate in and develop programming for the Hip Hop Youth Research and Activism (HHYRA) conference, an event that occurs annually at Rutgers University and involves a series of student-led workshops and discussions focused on art, activism, and popular culture. Research methods include triangulating information from three sources: observations of conference planning meetings, interviews with participants, and surveys of participants. The researchers seek to obtain a better understanding of how the participants experienced community, teaching, learning, and activism through hip-hop-based education.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has the potential to benefit youth arts practitioners, educators, and curricula combining art with activism.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

South Dakota State University

Grant Amount: \$35,000

Purpose: To support a mixed-methods survey assessing the impact of an artist-in-residence program on the creative behaviors of college students in arts, social science, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) fields.

Additional Project Description: Research questions will include examining 1) whether there is a measurable change in students' self-reported identification of creative behaviors after participating in the artist-in-residence program; 2) whether there is a measurable difference in how "creative behaviors" is defined by STEM students when compared with art and social science students; and 3) whether there is a measurable difference among STEM, art, and social science students in their intentions to engage in creative behaviors. The study will involve focus groups, surveys, and a comparison group of students who have not participated in the artist-in-residence programs.

Intended Beneficiaries: The project has the potential to benefit educators, curricula, and pedagogical approaches integrating the arts with STEM in college education.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Spy Hop Productions

Grant Amount: \$20,000

Purpose: To support a mixed-methods program evaluation study of a podcasting program on the attitudes, behaviors, and relationships of incarcerated youths and their extended communities.

Additional Project Description: In partnership with juvenile justice centers in Utah, researchers will explore the impact of the Sending Messages program, a ten-week long program designed to help young people craft and share authentic stories about their experiences and perspectives through self-produced podcasts. Assessment methods will include pre- and post-intervention surveys of the youth who participate, adult staff focus groups, and ethnographic observations conducted by the artist mentors who teach in the program. Factors to be measured include how the artistic projects impact community perception, and what changes appear in the social, emotional, relational, and behavioral health outcomes of participating youth.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has the potential to benefit policymakers, legal advocates, and youth in justice juvenile settings, particularly in the state of Utah.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Trustees of Tufts College, Tufts University School Of Medicine

Grant Amount: \$40,000

Purpose: To support a mixed-methods evaluation of the impact of co-designed public art installations on neighborhood residents' sense of cultural identity and social connectedness.

Additional Project Description: The evaluation will focus on the Hudson Street Stoop Project, a rotating public art initiative in Boston's Chinatown District. For this initiative, each art installation is jointly designed by teams of local residents, public arts advisors, and artists. Researchers will conduct an evaluation, document the process for developing new art installations, and conduct surveys with stakeholders at various points during the co-design process. Once the artworks are installed, researchers will develop and administer surveys to residents. Through the surveys, the researchers will explore the social and emotional well-being of the residents, and the prospects for community healing and civic engagement. The researchers will compare the survey responses of people who interacted with the artwork with the survey responses from people who did not. The Asian Community Development Corporation is a partner on the project.

Intended Beneficiaries: This study has the potential to benefit residents of the Boston Chinatown District as well as researchers and arts practitioners seeking to understand the benefit of public art installations on community cohesion.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign

Grant Amount: \$80,000

Purpose: To support a suite of data analysis reports that examine the careers and lives of alumni from arts and design programs in higher education.

Additional Project Description: In partnership with Ohio State University, researchers will analyze data from the 2022 Strategic National Arts Alumni Project (SNAAP), a large-scale national survey that documents the experiences and attributes of arts alumni. New to the 2022 data collection, the SNAAP survey will include items that address whether alumni experienced or did not experience an inclusive environment and sense of belonging during their college education, as well as how the careers, lives, and needed skills and abilities of arts and design alumni have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and by the changing nature of creative and other work environments. Quantitative survey data will be weighted to the general population to support the generalizability of the findings.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has the potential to benefit the post-secondary arts education field, including educators, arts practitioners, policymakers, and funders.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Purpose: To support a set of qualitative case studies on the motivations and experiences of artist-entrepreneurs of color in Memphis and the Mississippi Delta.

Additional Project Description: Artist-entrepreneurs will participate in in-depth interviews that address the following research questions: 1) how do artist-entrepreneur persons of color experience the process of artistic creativity in their communities; 2) what factors exert the greatest influence on the entrepreneurial success of these artist-entrepreneurs; and 3) how should stakeholders in industry, education, the nonprofit cultural sector, and government/policymaking better facilitate development of a more equitable and inclusive entrepreneurial ecosystem for persons of color in the arts? Results from this study will support the ongoing efforts of artists, funders, and stakeholders to create more equitable support systems within the arts sector.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has the potential to benefit primarily the support systems for artists and entrepreneurship in Memphis, Tennessee, and the Mississippi Delta region, including BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) workers.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Purpose: To support a systematic literature review and multiple case studies examining healthcare models of social prescribing for the arts.

Additional Project Description: Researchers will write a foundational paper on whether and how 1) social prescribing for the arts affects older adults' access to arts participation programs, and 2) social prescribing for the arts can be adapted for the U.S. healthcare system. The researchers will conduct a systematic literature review as well as in-depth interviews with key stakeholders such as medical practitioners, health policy and insurance systems experts, and individual artists. Further, by interviewing older adults who participate in social prescribing for arts programs internationally, the researchers will learn how social prescribing for the arts can succeed in providing access to arts participation and/or improving the health outcomes of older adults.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has the potential to benefit researchers and policymakers seeking to understand how to integrate the arts with public health strategies for older adults.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Purpose: To support a mixed-methods study of an intergenerational music program delivered by adolescent musicians to older adults with early-stage cognitive decline.

Additional Project Description: Researchers will develop an intergenerational music program and test the feasibility, acceptability, and potential effects of the program. Adolescents and older adults will be key stakeholders in developing, refining, and informing the program's protocol. Measurement methods include pre- and post-intervention assessments of positive and negative affect for older adults; observations and field notes from the music session; semi-structured interviews with the adolescents and older adults to understand the practicality and appropriateness of the music program; and surveys about the willingness of the adolescents and older adults to continue program participation.

Intended Beneficiaries: This project has the potential to benefit music organizations offering intergenerational music programming and those working with older adults with cognitive decline.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Vanderbilt University

Purpose: To support a mixed-methods study of the prevalence of arts internships and their role in students' transition from college to careers in the arts.

Additional Project Description: Using data from the Strategic National Arts Alumni Project, a large national survey that documents the experiences and attributes of arts alumni, researchers will analyze 1) what sociodemographic and educational factors, such as inequalities in gender, race, and socioeconomic status, account for which arts alumni are likely to participate in an internship (paid and/or unpaid); and 2) how internship participation affects career outcomes after graduation. Researchers also will conduct interviews with college and university personnel to understand how places of higher education address, or sometimes reproduce, inequalities in student internship and career opportunities.

Intended Beneficiaries: This study has the potential to benefit students and alumni of post-secondary arts education programs, as well as the program administrators.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Purpose: To support a National Endowment for the Arts Research Lab on the Arts, Creativity, Cognition, and Learning.

Additional Project Description: The project will include the design and implementation of a research agenda to address the following questions: 1) Who studies the arts and who teaches the arts in U.S. elementary, secondary, and post-secondary schools?; 2) Which schools provide which students access to comprehensive arts education?; and 3) How do arts students fare in and beyond school, compared with their non-arts peers? Researchers will develop the Music and Arts Education Data Lab (MADLab), a national hub for the analysis of large-scale quantitative data on arts students, arts educators, and the ecosystem of arts education in the United States across multiple arts disciplines.

The lab's keystone study will involve creating and analyzing data from a national survey of arts educators, exploring the status and nature of arts education in public schools. The team also will analyze several large-cohort, longitudinal, and publicly available datasets such as those from the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). One NCES survey, the Middle Grades Longitudinal Study, features arts survey items developed or refined by the National Endowment for the Arts.

The team also will host a series of researcher/practitioner convenings, produce research reports, create applied tools with accompanying toolkits, and develop a pre-doctoral graduate research training program in music and arts education research. Partnering arts organizations include the National Association for Music Education, the National Art Education Association, the National Dance Education Organization, the Educational Theatre Association, and Young Audiences.

Primary project activities will include: the design and publication of an evidence-based research agenda; the planning and implementation of a keystone study or a series of studies; the production of at least one research report for each research study; the dissemination of research products, study findings, data, tools, or services to other researchers, arts practitioners, and the general public; and the preparation and delivery of a briefing to the NEA on needs for the proposed research topic area, with recommendations on how those needs could be supported by the NEA and how the NEA Research Lab can be sustained in the future.

Intended Beneficiaries: This NEA Research Lab has the potential to benefit the arts education field, including K-12 students and their families, education policymakers, arts educators, and arts funders.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.

Purpose: To support a National Endowment for the Arts Research Lab on the Arts, Health, and Social/Emotional Well-Being.

Additional Project Description: The project will include the design and implementation of a research agenda to address the following questions: a) How successful are community-engaged public arts projects in reducing firearm violence; b) What are the characteristics of community-engaged public arts projects that are successful in helping to reduce firearm violence, and c) Does following a novel "best practice" model for commissioning and producing public art with communities increase the success of such projects in reducing firearm violence?

The key research study focuses on a hypothesis, supported by preliminary pilot data, that public art can benefit communities by reducing firearm-related police incidents (and other violent crimes). Researchers will expand a current database of public artworks in residential areas of Detroit to analyze the effects of art installed in public spaces on total firearm crime incidents involving youth under 18. Additional planned studies include: 1) developing and testing a best-practice model for commissioning public artworks, and 2) conducting a cost-benefit analysis of commissioning public art to reduce firearm injury.

Products likely to result from this lab include: research and policy briefs, and community engagement opportunities in Detroit via public art projects that seek to reduce firearm incidents. Community partners include City of Detroit City Walls & Blight Abatement Artist Program, Garage Cultural – a community arts education collective, Detroit Science Gallery, The Detroit Collaborative Design Center, and Detroit Cartography/Geography.

Primary project activities will include: the design and publication of an evidence-based research agenda; the planning and implementation of a keystone study or a series of studies; the production of at least one research report for each research study; the dissemination of research products, study findings, data, tools, or services to other researchers, arts practitioners, and the general public; and the preparation and delivery of a briefing to the NEA on needs for the proposed research topic area, with recommendations on how those needs could be supported by the NEA and how the NEA Research Lab can be sustained in the future.

Intended Beneficiaries: This NEA Research Lab has the potential to benefit researchers, practitioners, and policymakers seeking to address firearm violence prevention, and particularly communities in Detroit, Michigan.

Additional Project Description: The project will include the design and implementation of a research agenda to address the following questions: a) What are the cognitive and/or social processes of arts-based creativity, and how do they affect learning-related outcomes; and b) What are the most effective neurocognitive tests and technologies to measure those outcomes?

A team of scientists, clinicians, designers, and artists from the University of Minnesota and the university's Weisman Art Museum will collaborate on a research agenda measuring and fostering creativity development in adolescence through arts engagement. In the keystone study, researchers will conduct a community-based participatory study with diverse, underrepresented adolescents who will participate in a creative arts and science program during an academic year. To examine the program's impact on youth outcomes, the team will use qualitative research approaches (i.e., in-depth interviews, observations of participants, arts-based methods) and quantitative ones (i.e., pre- and post-program self-report measures), as well as brain scans, to assess cognitive and social processes in adolescent creativity and arts development. The team will co-develop a study task that can be completed while in an MRI scanner, and which will allow researchers to measure research participants' brain processes while engaging in the task. An additional product will include a Weisman Art Museum showcase of the adolescents' artwork.

Primary project activities will include: the design and publication of an evidence-based research agenda; the planning and implementation of a keystone study or a series of studies; the production of at least one research report for each research study; the dissemination of research products, study findings, data, tools, or services to other researchers, arts practitioners, and the general public; and the preparation and delivery of a briefing to the NEA on needs for the proposed research topic area, with recommendations on how those needs could be supported by the NEA and how the NEA Research Lab can be sustained in the future.

Intended Beneficiaries: This NEA Research Lab has the potential to benefit arts practitioners and educators in the creative youth development field, including those working to integrate the arts with science learning for students from diverse and underrepresented backgrounds.

Additional Project Description: The project will include the design and implementation of a research agenda to address the following questions: a) What are the effects of music training interventions on music achievement, bimanual coordination (activities are skills that use two hands to complete), executive functions (a set of mental skills that include working memory, flexible thinking, and self-control), and attention across the lifespan; b) What are the most effective neurocognitive transfer and technologies to measure those outcomes?; c) How much training is necessary to generate sustainable benefits?; d) How do learning-related outcomes vary by age, socioeconomic characteristics, other demographic/behavioral patterns, and by health/disability status; and e) What are the benefits and related outcomes for specific music approaches to arts learning in formal or informal settings?

The keystone study will examine the effects of fine motor learning (piano instruction), gross motor learning (percussion instruction), and no motor learning (music appreciation) in a randomized sample of children, young adults, and older adults. The study will use standardized measures of music achievement, executive functioning, attention, and motor skills assessed prior to participation, as well as at follow-up intervals of one, two, and three months.

Products likely to result from this lab will include peer-reviewed journal publications, as well as a toolkit to be made publicly available on the lab's website. The toolkit will contain research articles, video lessons, student interviews, course materials/manuals, research slides, and developmental teaching strategies. Partners include Kuumba Dancers and Drummers and the Patel Conservatory at the Straz Center for the Performing Arts.

Primary project activities will include: the design and publication of an evidence-based research agenda; the planning and implementation of a keystone study or a series of studies; the production of at least one research report for each research study; the dissemination of research products, study findings, data, tools, or services to other researchers, arts practitioners, and the general public; and the preparation and delivery of a briefing to the NEA on needs for the proposed research topic area, with recommendations on how those needs could be supported by the NEA and how the NEA Research Lab can be sustained in the future.

Additional Project Description: The project will include the design and implementation of a research agenda to address the following questions: 1) What role might arts-based education in design and technology play in amplifying the employability of neurodiverse youth, in both arts and non-arts based sectors?; and 2) What larger roles do arts and cultural assets play in promoting civic innovation and entrepreneurial efforts in and around neurodiverse communities?

To address high unemployment among neurodiverse populations, researchers in art and design, sociology, and mechanical engineering will partner with the nonprofit organization, Islands of Brilliance, to create the Autism Brilliance Lab for Entrepreneurship. The keystone study will include a longitudinal analysis of participant outcomes from the Islands of Brilliance program, which offers creativity-focused workshops, mentorships, on-the-job training, consulting, and other programming to help neurodiverse students acquire skills that prepare them to succeed in post-secondary and workplace opportunities. Data sources include online surveys of students and their parents/guardians and mentors, as well as video-recorded observations of student-mentor interactions.

Products likely to result from this lab will include academic journal publications, conference presentations, exhibitions, and new, evidence-based programming for job training.

Primary project activities will include: the design and publication of an evidence-based research agenda; the planning and implementation of a keystone study or a series of studies; the production of at least one research report for each research study; the dissemination of research products, study findings, data, tools, or services to other researchers, arts practitioners, and the general public; and the preparation and delivery of a briefing to the NEA on needs for the proposed research topic area, with recommendations on how those needs could be supported by the NEA and how the NEA Research Lab can be sustained in the future.

Intended Beneficiaries: This NEA Research Lab has the potential to benefit neurodiverse students and their families and mentors, as well as employers seeking to work with these communities.

Intended Outcome: Evidence of the value and impact of the arts is expanded and promoted.
