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Chairman's Statement

In 1965 Congress "found and declared that the encouragement and support of national progress... in the arts, while primarily a matter of private and local initiative, is also a matter of concern to the Federal Government." Those words paved the legislative way to the creation of the National Endowment for the Arts and its advisory body, the National Council on the Arts. While this annual report properly focuses on our accomplishments in Fiscal Year 1975, the tenth anniversary offers a wider perspective for this introduction.

In its ten years, the Endowment has forged creative partnerships among state and local governments, community organizations, individual artists, producing companies, cultural institutions and the federal government. These partnerships were promoted by a wise provision in the law requiring that most Endowment grants be matched by money from other sources. Thus, federal dollars spent for the arts stimulate two or three from private citizens, businesses, and state and local governments. As a result, the arts have a broader base of support, with more Americans involved in cultural activity at all levels.

The arts flourish in America today, in part because of help from all these sources. America has artists as great as any in the world-because they have the innate talent to capitalize on widening opportunities, and because they are encouraged by the increased attention their work receives. We have cultural institutions as fine as any that existbecause private efforts created them and continue to sustain them, with modest local, state and federal help. We have a public that hungers for the arts and participates in cultural events-a far larger and more active audience than ten years ago.

Attendance and participation in cultural events are increasing all over the country. Music festivals were sold out last summer. Broadway had its best season in years, and resident theatres across the land were busy. The American Music Conference reported that three-fourths of all music retailers enjoyed substantially higher sales. Craft shows and art galleries were popular, to mention just a few indexes.

Yet this success poses a paradox: good business in the arts is "bad business." The more successful an orchestra becomes, for example, the larger its deficit grows: each concert costs more to present than ticket sales can recover. Earned income rarely covers operating costs.

That problem has existed throughout history; art often has not carned its wav in the marketplace. For centuries it relied on patronage, the benevolence of a church or ruler; in the modern era it has turned to generous wealthy patrons for support: individuals, foundations and corporations continue to build the cultural resources of our nation today. In this past decade the federal and state governments have recognized and shouldered their responsibility to serve as nonauthoritarian catalysts-to help close the gap between earnings and expenses without ever dictating artistic policies.

Ironically, the arts, though not selfsupporting, are a fertile economic resource. In New York, the Mayor's Committee on Cultural Policy reported that artistic and cultural activities generate over \$3 billion in expenditures and receipts annually. In Ashland, Oregon, a town of 10,000, the Oregon Shakespearean Festival provides 400 jobs and attracts 200,000 visitors. The Chicago Chamber of Commerce called the city's major cultural institutions "the most important tourist attraction we have." In Philadelphia, 50 cultural organizations serve 13 million people a year, 10 million more than attend professional sports events there. In Atlanta, Galveston, Denver and elsewhere, new arts facilities are focal points for urban revitalization.

"It is not surprising that there is an increasing public interest in the arts," wrote a friend of the arts recently. "They enhance the quality of life, renew the senses, remind us that we are vital. We have begun to reevaluate their importance, to accept without apology their ability to quicken the mind and refresh the spirit, to regard them not as a privilege of the few but as a right of the many—the pursuit of happiness."

When Thomas Jefferson coined that last phrase 200 years ago could he have had the arts in mind? I think so, and it is certainly fitting that the arts will play a central role in the bicentennial celebration next year. Toward this end, the Endowment awarded more than 1,000 grants in 1974 and 1975, totaling more than \$27 million, which will have direct impact on the bicentennial and lasting effect on the country. Some examples:

- Boston's development of a city-wide network of paths to help both visitors and residents alike in the discovery of historic Boston. This is one of 80 projects that enable communities to enhance their physical environments while focusing on local heritage.
- Creation by Alvin Ailey of two major works to the music of Duke Ellington.
- Special efforts by arts agencies in 31 states to make the arts important parts of celebrations in those states.
- Cooperative commissions by groups of major symphony orchestras for the creation and performance of 18 new works by American composers.

Such projects will live long after the bicentennial year.

As we look forward to the opening of the Endowment's second decade and the nation's third century, the need is unmistakable for continued federal support of the arts.

Achieving the Endowment's Goals

The following brief review shows how the Endowment's grants and programs have worked toward achieving the Endowment's three goals:

Improved Accessibility of the Arts—to promote broad dissemination of cultural resources of the highest quality throughout the United States.

Almost half the Endowment's budget in 1975 supported projects designed to make the arts more widely available. Some projects involved taking a performing group, such as an opera company, to a city where a known audience exists. Others involved offering isolated or insulated communities (whether rural or inner-city) new opportunities of expression through folk arts or expanded horizons near home.

Such work began during the Endowment's first year when we supported touring by music, theatre and dance companies, when plans were laid for programs in broadcasting and film, when the forerunner of the Education Program was launched, when the first efforts were made to expand museums' services and place works of art in public places. Some examples:

In 1966 Martha Graham considered moving to Europe where her company had a better chance of economic survival. Instead, an Endowment grant enabled the troupe to make its first national tour in 15 years and perform in 32 American cities, triggering a nationwide explosion of interest in dance, still our fastest growing performing art. Today the Dance Touring Program is administered cooperatively by the state arts agencies and the Endowment. The federal contribution amounts to \$3.6 million this year and each federal dollar generates between \$4 and \$5 in local matching funds. This year 94 companies toured in all 50 states and two special jurisdictions for an aggregate of more than 400 weeks.

Similarly, we promote touring by opera companies, orchestras, museum exhibits, architectural and design shows, jazz groups and theatre groups. For the second year we assisted "tour events" under the aegis of Expansion Arts. That involves bringing arts groups into urban, suburban and rural areas where access to the arts has been difficult or limited. Thus far, groups from 25 states in four regions have been brought together to exchange ideas and talent. Expansion Arts also works "in place," helping local groups encourage the creativity of local people.

Thirty-two state and regional arts agencies have, with support from the Endowment's Public Media Program, produced films which focus on local cultural traditions. Another film is being made on two hundred years of American song; a major dance series is showing on national television; an American drama series is being televised and a radio drama series is being developed by Wisconsin and Minnesota producers for national distribution. In addition, we helped develop 28 media centers in different parts of the country to serve as regional focal points for production and exhibition of film and video art.

One of the Endowment's earliest grants, for \$46,000, went to the Academy of American Poets to enable poets to work in several New York schools. The idea spread rapidly and became Artists-in-Schools. Today the Artists-in-Schools program, managed cooperatively by state arts agencies and the Endowment. reaches more than 5,000 schools in all 50 states and the five special jurisdictions (District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa and Virgin Islands). In addition to poetry, it now involves dance, crafts, painting, sculpture, music, drama, film, folk arts, architecture and design.

The first support to museums was given in 1967; our Museum Program was organized four years later and has grown ten-fold. A major purpose here is to assist museums in meeting the increased demands for their services.

The Endowment's Art in Public Places project, under the direction of our Visual Arts Program, has helped place paintings and sculpture in 37 states where they are enjoyed by uncounted people conducting their daily affairs.

The Federal-State Partnership Program administers bloc grants to the arts agencies of the fifty states and five special jurisdictions. The first state grants, of \$25,000, supported surveys of cultural resources; this year the bloc grant to each state was \$200,000. Substantial Endowment funds also go to the states through a variety of other programs that help local program development, strengthen community services, provide liaison among the states and serve a number of other ends.

Cultural Resources Development—to help the nation's cultural institutions best serve the public and improve their artistic and administrative standards.

In 1966 the agency's budget of \$2.5 million precluded significant support for the development of cultural institutions.

By 1975 larger appropriations enabled the Endowment to devote more than \$20 million to aid 105 orchestras, 42 opera companies, some 500 museums, 150 theatre groups of all kinds, 63 dance companies, 200 literary magazines and 70 independent presses.

The Music Program assisted performing groups of all kinds. The Museum Program aided in purchase of new works, presentation of special exhibitions, new and innovative use of permanent collections, cataloguing of their treasures, and employment of visiting experts. Endowment support was a crucial factor in the survival of more than 50 resident professional theatres around a nation that could claim barely 15 a decade ago.

The economics of commercial publishing has forced major houses to virtually ignore new talent in recent years. Many emerging writers of high promise, therefore, are first published by small circulation literary magazines and independent presses supported by the Endowment's Literature Program. This support is proving crucial to the future of American literature.

Advancement of Our Cultural Heritage to support artists of exceptional talent in every discipline; to encourage the preservation of our diverse cultural legacies; to enhance the quality of American life through the arts.

The idea of an "American melting pot" went out of fashion with the awareness that the nation's mettle is strong because its elements are diverse, not homogeneous. Nowhere is this clearer than in the cultural realtm. Our cultural heritage includes the traditions of countless immigrant and native peoples; the living traditions are as varied as George Balanchine's ballets and Aleut carvings. America's original contributions to world culture include jazz, steel beam architecture, modern dance and movies, to name just a few.

A cultural legacy involves concrete things as well as thought. Endowment programs assist physical projects; the Museum Program supports improved climate control and security; the Architecture Program works to preserve and find new uses for historic buildings and to maintain the identity of older neighborhoods; the Public Media Program supports work that preserves artistic films and captures such ephemeral performing arts as dance on film and video tape.

Advancing a legacy also depends on enabling elderly artists to pass on their skills to younger successors. This is a major focus of the Folk Arts Program, which is advancing indigenous American art forms such as Indian design, country music and narrative history.

In 1966 the Endowment made its first efforts in advancing our rich legacies by supporting the source of all cultural creativity—the individual artist. This year more than 700 individuals received fellowships which enabled them to buy time and materials to advance their careers and their art. Continually evolving forms of fellowship aid go to choreographers, sculptors, painters, craftsmen, photographers, novelists, poets, dramatists, librettists, composers, jazz, folk, and ethnic musicians, filmmakers, designers and architects.

We face a challenge here: For an artist to create what society needs, he must be given the opportunity to try. He may succeed, or he may fall short of the mark. That is the gamble of backing pure creativity.

The Endowment believes it is a gamble worth taking—and that we are, indeed, carrying out the wishes of the Congress in backing those most responsible for carrying the arts forward today—the individual artists.

The Endowment will continue to support promising individuals as they develop their talents; we will continue to support the performing groups that present them and the institutions that preserve them. We will continue to expand our own research capacity and our support of service organizations and environmental arts efforts. Because, as President Lyndon B. Johnson said when the legislation became law 10 years ago, nations of the past that left no lasting art are "just footnotes in history's textbooks. The United States, we believe, has just begun to write entire new chapters in the arts.

Organization

National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities

The National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities was established as an independent agency of the Executive Branch of the Federal government by the National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities Act of 1965. The Act, Public Law 89-209, was last amended by Public Law 93-133 in October 1973.

The National Foundation is composed of the Federal Council on the Arts and the Humanities, the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Humanities. The two Endowments, advised by their respective Councils, formulate their own programs, but share an administrative staff.

National Council on the Arts

The National Council on the Arts is composed of the Chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, who serves as Chairman of the Council and 26 private citizens, appointed by the President, who are widely recognized for their broad knowledge of the arts, or for their experience or profound interest in the arts.

The Council advises the Chairman on policies, programs, and procedures, and reviews and makes recommendations on applications for financial assistance made to the National Endowment.

The Council, formed in 1964, preceded by approximately one year the establishment of the National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities.

National Endowment for the Arts

The National Endowment for the Arts, an agency of the Federal government, carries out programs of grants-in-aid to arts agencies of the states and U.S. jurisdictions, to nonprofit, tax-exempt organizations, and to individuals of exceptional talent.

The Endowment is headed by a Chairman, nominated by the President and confirmed by the Senate. Miss Nancy Hanks was sworn in as Chairman on October 6, 1969 for a four year term and reappointed by the President for a second term beginning October 5, 1973.

Special bloe grants to state and jurisdictional arts agencies under the Federal-State Partnership Program are made in accordance with the terms set forth in the National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities Act of 1965 as amended in October 1973.

The Endowment's other programs are developed by the Chairman and the staff, with the advice of the National Council on the Arts. As a general rule, applications for grants which fall within the established programs of the Endowment are referred to panels of experts chosen from all regions of the United States. The recommendations of the panels are brought before the National Council for review, and to the Chairman for final determination.

Descriptions of the Endowment's programs and lists of grants and contracts obligated from fiscal 1975 program funds are included on the following pages. Also listed are the men and women who served on the Endowment's Advisory Panels.

Federal Council on the Arts and the Humanities

The Federal Council on the Arts and the Humanities, established within the National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities by the Act of 1965, is composed of the Chairmen of the two Endowments (the Arts and the Humanities), the United States Commissioner of Education, the Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution, the Director of the National Science Foundation, the Librarian of Congress, the Director of the National Gallery of Art, the Chairman of the Commission of Fine Arts, the Archivist of the United States, a member designated by the Secretary of State, a member designated by the Secretary of the Interior, the Public Buildings Service Commissioner of the General Services Administration, a member appointed by the Chairman of the United States Senate Commission on Arts and Antiquities and a member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

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Architecture + Environmental Arts



The Architecture + Environmental Arts Program assists those who would improve the quality of the built environment and supports the advancement of all design disciplines. Fiscal 1975 grants have supported projects in architecture, urban design, city and regional planning, landscape architecture, industrial design and interior design.

Toward improving the quality of our environment, the Architecture + Environmental Arts Program has initiated theme grant categories: City Edges, emphasizing design and planning for problems related to urban boundary conditions, and City Options, focusing on projects that preserve areas of distinctive character and identity in communities. Both programs have been designated bicentennial projects by the National Council on the Arts.

Projects supported by the City Edges program in 1975 include an analysis by Tulane University's School of Architecture of New Orleans riverfront and design options; a study by the City of Albuquerque to determine how the Rio Grande river could be conserved as a natural environment; and a study of waterfront fish business in five cities to determine how these businesses can be blended into city renewal plans.

As cities spread, small towns and neighborhoods, once separate and unique, are engulfed. Under a City Options grant, the Historic Seattle Preservation and Development Authority is conducting a neighborhood-by-neighborhood investigation of the urban and historic elements that give Scattle its composite character, and the neighborhoods their individual identity. The study will aid long-range planning to preserve unique buildings, vistas or other elements.

Nineteenth-century urban Annapolis has been all but obliterated in the last 50 years as expansion and the automobile have dispersed human activity away from the city. A grant to Historic Annapolis, Inc. is aimed at reclaiming the pedestrian's streetscape; finding the cobblestone, brick and Belgian block beneath the macadam; planning for attractive street furniture such as seating, lighting and signs; and preparing the city for its bicentennial celebrations.

These projects and those on the following pages encourage new thought for old problems and seek to assure recognition of human factors in the design of our cities.

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Dance



The Dance Program is designed to support the high quality of artistic development in the field. Recipients of grants range from individual choreographers to professional touring companies. Successful projects resulting from federal funding are nationwide. The following illustrations are a sampling of the widespread impact in the country.

Under the Dance Touring Program the Walker Art Center in Minneapolis sponsored the Twyla Tharp Dance Company for four weeks. The public, which was invited to attend rehearsals and master classes, had a rare opportunity to observe a choreographer at work. These efforts culminated in the first performance of a new jazz ballet.

Similar community involvement was encouraged by funds assisting small western towns to sponsor regional touring groups. Albuquerque Dance Theater, Ballet Folk of Moscow (Idaho), Maria Benitez Estampa Flamenca (Santa Fe), and Oregon Mime Theatre were given residencies in several western states. The project provided a valuable experience for the young companies and the local audiences.

On the individual level, a choreography fellowship was awarded to Carlos Carvajal, artistic director of Dance Spectrum Company in San Francisco. The grant enabled him to create two new works, "Hosts" and "Facade," which have given him national recognition in the field.

Through grants such as these, the Dance Program seeks to achieve two purposes: to make dance accessible to all Americans and to encourage the expansion of the art through the creation of new works. The full range of projects supported by the Dance Program is listed on the following pages.

Education



The Education Program's primary concern is to place professional artists in educational situations and to encourage local community groups to fund their own similar endeavors.

Under the Artists-in-Schools program, the artists lead children toward self-awareness and an artistic sensibility. Under the Alternative Education program, artists encourage alternative methods of learning through the arts, at all age levels, through grants to community cultural centers and other alternative learning situations. A limited number of grants to graduate programs in Arts Administration also are available, as are limited grants under General Programs.

The Artists-in-Schools program, developed in co-operation with the U.S. Office of Education, began as a pilot program in six states in 1969-1970. Today more than 2,000 professionals—architects, craftsmen, dancers, filmmakers, folk artists, musicians, poets, actors and visual artists work in elementary and secondary schools in all 50 states and the five special jurisdictions.

For example, Bella Lewitzky, hailed by Clive Barnes as "one of America's great modern dancers," has been in residence with her company in schools throughout the nation. In another field, student participants in John McDonald's filmmaking residency in Glendale, California, won the CINE Eagle Award, a high honor for an amateur motion picture.

Recognizing the need to reach young audiences outside a traditional classroom setting, the Alternative Education component of the Education Program supports such organizations as the Creative Arts Center of the New Orleans Public Schools and the Elma Lewis project in Massachusetts, as well as other community arts—oriented projects around the country.

These activities may include training in the arts and are available to the general community. These grants reflect a type of concern expressed in a recent report of the National Panel on High School and Adolescent Education which states that "feasible and manageable alternatives to present 'educational patterns' are needed," and recommends "new places for education... the creation of a community arts center closely associated with the high school."

It is the hope of the Education Program that its modest support for these projects and those listed on the following pages will encourage greater financial commitments from communities to place artists in educational situations.



Expansion Arts



The Expansion Arts Program supports, through matching grants, cultural projects initiated by community-based, professionally-directed arts organizations. Community-based projects are defined as those which arise spontaneously from groups which share a common location, ethnic origin or economic situation and which have been outside the reach of mainstream American culture.

Unlike most Endowment programs, Expansion Arts is not limited to one artistic discipline; it includes them all. Expansion Arts activities mirror American's cultural diversity. They include arts activities of ethnic groups of all types and origins; projects in remote communities as well as urban neighborhoods; and work in a variety of special environments in which the arts are both lacking and needed, such as prisons and hospitals.



The Youth Screen Printing Factory of Dayton, Ohio, has received Endowment assistance since 1970 to provide training and meaningful jobs to inner-city youth. Today there are two facilities, a training school and a factory, both located in a Model Cities target area where the population is 99 percent black and poor. Students are 8 to 25 years old; priority is given to high school drop-outs. The two-year program teaches both the silk screen printing process and the over-all operation of a small business. A final phase helps the students find jobs.

Galveston, Texas, was one of 11 cities selected as hosts for the 1975 Expansion Arts Tour Events. This project, now completing its second year, helps artists to exhibit their work outside their local areas. During the three-day "Festival USA on the Strand," approximately 500 artists and craftsmen and 18,000 spectators participated in exhibitions and performances brought from Texas, Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi.

Jailed juveniles in Minnesota are the targets of an experimental program to use the arts as a means of rehabilitation. The project, undertaken by a group called New Focus: Arts and Corrections, attempts, through artistic experience, to raise damaged self-images, raise levels of individual success, and provide self-expression through the arts as an alternative to self-destructive criminal acts. The project was developed jointly by the Minnesota Department of Corrections and the St. Paul Council of Arts and Sciences.

Through such projects as these, the Expansion Arts program aims to involve more Americans in the arts, to encourage the cultural expression of diverse people as well as cross-cultural exchange, and to use the arts in achieving social and educational goals.

Federal-State Partnership Program

The Federal-State Partnership Program was developed to assist the state arts agencies in providing arts programming at the local level. The arts agencies are essential links in the national network of support for the arts. Operating as a part of the state government, each agency has developed its own set of programs to provide new opportunities for artists within their communities and to encourage wider participation in local arts activities. Like brokers, the state agencies generate and distribute funds, coordinate resources and provide technical assistance. Grants are made to support festivals, workshops, residencies, community arts agencies, touring exhibits, crafts fairs and literary guids. Many state agencies also provide fellowships to individual artists-choreographers, composers, poets, playwrights, painters, filmmakers, video artists, graphic artists, sculptors and writers.

In Fiscal Year 1975 each agency was eligible to receive a basic grant of \$200,000 in addition to grants awarded under other programs of the Arts Endowment. Community development awards provided funds for challenge grants, cultural resource inventories and administrative and technical assistance to community arts agencies. Program development grants helped provide state arts agencies with increased staff who may serve, for example, as Indian coordinators, ethnic/expansion arts coordinators or folklorists, or give additional aid in the national programs such as Dance Touring and Artists-in-Schools. The Federal-State Partnership Program also assists states engaged in touring projects. For example, grants were made to sponsor tours of the Newport Jazz Festival in the midwest, Ballet West throughout the western states, the Audubon String Quartet in northeast Pennsylvania and the Satori Woodwind Quartet in Delaware.

The Regional Coordinator program was expanded in fiscal 1975 to include seven coordinators working in all 50 states and five jurisdictions. It is the responsibility of these coordinators to assist the state arts agencies, artists and cultural organizations and the Endowment in the exchange of information and ideas for arts programming in all areas of the country.

Literature

More than 250 American poets and fiction writers were published in book form for the first time through grants to small non-profit presses from the Arts Endowment's Literature Program.

Although works by new writers often are published in small literary magazines, it has been difficult, sometimes impossible, for such writers to publish in single volumes of their own. For this reason, the Literature Program's small press grants represent a significant breakthrough for many talented writers who are only beginning to be recognized.

In general, these volumes from independent presses are small in size, inexpensive and paperbound. During the year more than 400 volumes, or "chapbooks," were published with Endowment assistance. It is anticipated that they will reach nearly 750,000 readers.

To give writers a first opportunity, the Literature Program provides subgrants—through the Coordinating Council of Literary Magazines, 80 Eighth Avenue, New York, N.Y. 10011—to approximately 300 small quarterlies each year. Endowment aid has enabled many magazines to continue publication on a more regular basis than ever before.

Nearly everything done by the Literature Program is aimed at helping individual writers or editors. In 1974 and 1975 a program of fellowships for creative writers allowed 155 poets, fiction writers and playwrights to pursue their careers with small stipends from the Arts Endowment. Work created during this period is now being seen in literary magazines, small press chapbooks and in volumes from trade publishers.

Of equal importance to a large number of creative writers during the past nine years has been the Endowment's program placing poets and fiction writers in elementary and secondary classrooms. In Fiscal Year 1975, close to 1,000 writers were in residence on a part-time basis in schools throughout the nation.

The effect of the program on children has been hailed by teachers and poets alike. It encourages self-expression and strengthens most children's interest in language and learning.

The impact can be equally great on the poets and their work. As John Eskow, a poet working in New York state, said: "I've found that working with children has given me a much clearer perspective on my poems. It's easier to stand back and look at your work when you know you're going to be reading it to eight or ten-year-olds. They see through all the fraud."

A first grade student in Jefferson school, Fargo, North Dakota, wrote: "Poems come out of barns like ghosts."

It seems likely that this student, and many others like him, will regard good writing with greater respect and interest than he would have if the poet had not been in the school.

In such ways as these, the Literature Program promotes the growth of writing, publishing and reading in this country.

Museums

The Museum Program, begun in 1971, aims to make the facilities of museums available to a wider audience, to expand the educational contributions of museums, and to aid the professional development of museum professionals. Grants are made to enable museums to purchase new works, mount special exhibitions, conserve and renovate their collections, bring in visiting specialists, prepare catalogues of their collections, and train museum professionals. The Museum Program also has played an important role in enabling museums to participate in the nation's bicentennial celebration.

Aided by the Endowment, four small museums in the state of Washington have banded together in a cooperative venture to purchase drawings by living American artists. The works are examples of the highest standards of contemporary American art and will be rotated in exhibitions at the participating museums and at several other locations. In awarding this grant, the Museum Program has responded to a growing national trend among museums for sharing facilities, staff and collections for the benefit of all.

An exhibit called "The European Vision of America" has been mounted by the Cleveland Museum of Art and will tour other cities in America and Europe. The exhibit contains 350 items ranging from early maps and rare botanical drawings to painting, sculpture, and exquisite objects in gold. It is a visual chronicle, not of history, but of an idea--the myth of America as it was held by Europeans from the time of Columbus to the 1850's. In the European mind, America-and especially the American Indian-held a mythical, almost allegorical, significance. It is this myth of America, rather than its actual history, that is traced out in an exhibition that has been captivating its viewers.

Perhaps a less glamourous but equally important grant was awarded to the Milwaukee Art Center to conserve the works of art in its permanent collection. Much of this collection, behind closed doors for years, now will be made available to the public for the first time.

The following list illustrates the diversity of projects funded through the Museum Program and demonstrates the dynamic role museums continue to play in their communities and the cultural life of America.

Music

Grants awarded by the Music Program are designed to support excellence in all areas of music performance and creativity and to develop informed audiences for music throughout the entire country.

To achieve these purposes, grants are given to a wide range of organizations and individuals including professional symphony orchestras and opera companies, American composers and librettists, professional independent schools of music, individuals and organizations engaged in jazz, folk and ethnic musics, and national service organizations.


In fiscal 1975 assistance was provided to some 105 orchestras for such projects as the Minnesota Orchestra Association's young concert artist series and the Chattanooga Symphony's concerts in small area colleges and school systems. The Seattle Symphony provided readings and rehearsals of works by gifted students at the University of Washington, and the Jackson Symphony extended its educational programs throughout Mississippi. Aid to the American Symphony Orchestra League provided administrative and technical assistance to some 1200 orchestras. Grants were also awarded to commission the creation and performance of orchestral works.

Similarly, the opera field benefited from grants to some 40 regional companies, while Endowment aid to Opera America and the National Opera Institute enabled those organizations to expand their services to a significantly larger public. The Texas Opera Theatre, a professional touring ensemble created by the Houston Grand Opera, brought music theatre to West Texas and Gulf Coast areas in presentations adaptable to such settings as schools and churches. Opera New England, started by the Opera Society of Boston, took professional performances and workshops to five New England states.

In programs designed to encourage native musical expression, the Endowment assisted the First Presbyterian Church of Ann Arbor, Michigan to present folk artists for children's concerts and workshops. The Idaho Migrant Council brought Los Changitos Feos, a mariachi group from Arizona, for performances in southern Idaho; and the Johnstown Jazz Workshop took jazz instrumentalists into school districts of central and western Pennsylvania for school and public performances.

Throughout the Music Program, grants encourage the performance of contemporary music and assistance to American musicians. The full list of projects supported appears on the following pages.

Public Media



The National Endowment for the Arts has always recognized the importance of film and the electronic media to the cultural life of the nation and has encouraged projects within these fields. By supporting quality arts performances on radio, television and film, the Public Media Program seeks to bring the arts to millions of Americans who might never be reached by live performances.

One grantee, WNET-TV, in cooperation with Exxon and the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB), will present a "Dance in America" series which will be offered to over 250 public broadcasting stations. The series will highlight the achievements of contemporary American dance artists in both choreography and performance. In cooperation with the Ford Foundation and CPB, the Endowment has supported the American Television Drama Series, a four-year effort to develop and produce original dramas by American authors for broadcast on public television.

The Public Media Program's support for radio production includes a grant to the University of Wisconsin's Earplay Project for the production of a series of 39 one-hour dramas specifically designed for radio.

Through the Bicentennial State Film program, more than 25 grants were awarded to state and regional arts agencies for films that reflect the arts or cultural activities of a particular region.

The Public Media Program also encourages the widest possible access to and participation in the art of film through its support of regional film centers in 13 states. These centers provide programs of film classics and contemporary cinematic art, as well as information on the art of video and film for the public.

In addition, the Public Media Program has, since its beginnings, provided support to the American Film Institute for its Independent Filmmaker Grant program and its work in preserving and developing the nation's artistic and cultural resources in film.

Through these grants and those listed on the following pages, the Public Media Program supports efforts to bring excellence in the arts to all Americans, particularly those beyond the reach of the performance hall.

Special Projects

The Special Projects Program was developed to give the Endowment increased flexibility in funding multidisciplined projects and those which do not fit under the guidelines of other programs. It consolidates elements of a number of other Endowment programs in an effort to explore new ground—to find new audiences, new sponsors, new opportunities for the arts.

Under the category, Interrelated Programs and Special Services, the Centrum Foundation of Port Townsend, Washington, received a grant to help its Center for Creativity at nearby Fort Worden State Park, an old army post with a spectacular site and old but useful buildings. The Center offers a yearround series of workshops, conferences, residencies and performances. For example, in the past year, they have held a writers' symposium, a chamber music festival and a Fourth of July celebration of folk crafts.

Grants to assist folk arts, formerly handled by several Endowment programs, have now been gathered under the Folks Arts division of the Special Projects Program. In fiscal 1975 funds were given for such projects as a documentation of the Serbian and Croatian immigrant experience in America, an exhibit and book honoring 80 years of pottery making by the Meaders family of north Georgia, studies and recordings of guitar music in the old Hawaiian slack key style and recordings of the songs of the Southern Arapaho Indians.

The City Spirit program was developed this year to encourage "arts and nonarts" interests to come together to explore and plan for the cultural life of the community. In California, the Pasadena Community Services Commission developed a planning model. The aim is to establish citizen steering committees, monthly "catalyst" arts projects, and new alliances among arts groups, business and government. Theatre

The Theatre Program is geared toward bringing quality theatre to Americans of all ages and backgrounds. To accomplish this purpose, the program places its emphasis upon assistance to the artists of the theatre and to the performing institutions which sustain those artists and craftsmen. The aim of the program is not only to encourage the continuity of the best of our theatrical heritage, but also to stimulate the development of new talent and to raise artistic standards in the field.

Over the past 25 years, the dominant trend in American theatre has been the development of permanent professional theatres in cities and towns across the nation. This has meant that more artists are working, a more diverse repertory is produced, and more Americans than ever before have the opportunity to see live performance of professional quality. The Theatre Program seeks to assist this growth and thus to help provide the best theatre for the broadest possible audience.

One Endowment grant in 1975 assisted the Seattle Repertory Theatre in opening a second, smaller theatre to produce modern, experimental works. Another will help the McCarter Theatre in Princeton, New Jersey, produce six American plays for the bicentennial season. A third has enabled Dell-Arte, a small developmental theatre, in producing works that apply the technique of the Commedia del-Arte to the myths and tribal ceremonies of North American Indians.

The Acting Company, an offshoot of the Juilliard School of Drama, is the major full-time professional touring company in the country. Aided by the Endowment, the company performed in 53 cities in 23 states during the 1974-75 season.

The Dallas Theatre Center's program for the development of new plays has received Endowment support for a number of years. Among the results of this support is the work of a new playwright, Preston Jones, whose trilogy, already performed successfully in Dallas and Washington, D.C., will be produced on Broadway in 1976.

Through activities such as these and those listed on the following pages, the Theatre Program furthers the continuing growth and enrichment of theatre in America.

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Visual Arts





The Visual Arts Program responds directly to the needs of the individual artist and supports a broad range of projects designed to benefit the public. Fellowships are awarded to individual artists of exceptional talent, and grants are made for the commissioning and placement of works of art in public places; for workshops and alternative exhibition spaces; for short-term residencies of artists in educational and cultural institutions; and for numerous other programs including support for exhibitions of photography and crafts, services to the field and craftsmen apprenticeships.

Since 1967, 474 fellowships have been awarded to painters, sculptors, photographers, craftsmen, video artists, printmakers and critics in 48 states. These fellowships enable artists to buy materials, and spend time developing new work and advancing their careers.

Other components of the Visual Arts Program bring artists and their work directly to the public. Under one Artist-in-Residence grant to the Union of Independent Colleges of Art, 144 distinguished artists, photographers, craftsmen and critics made 179 visits to the eight UICA member art schools. The artists, who were in residence for a total of 338 days during the 1974-75 academic year, also participated in arts activities with other local institutions and community groups.

The Portland Center for the Visual Arts is one of the numerous organizations throughout the country assisted by the Workshop Program. Since opening in 1972 with Endowment assistance, the Portland Center has become vital to the arts on the West Coast and prominent nationally. With increasing local and state support, it has mounted exhibitions and presented lectures and seminars which have included such artists as Jack Tworkov, Carl Andre, Vito Acconci and Donald Judd.

The Visual Arts Program also extends into less conventional situations. Collaborative efforts between artists and performing arts companies are encouraged. Iowa artist Byron Burford designed sets, props and costumes for the Jo Lechay Dance Company of Iowa City. The designs incorporate the circus and parade themes developed by Burford in his prints and paintings.

The Visual Arts Program continues to support the public art efforts of City Walls, Inc., an organization formed by a group of artists who started painting murals on walls in New York City. Since 1967, 46 murals have been completed.

The Treasury Fund

When the National Endowment for the Arts was created, Congress included a unique provision in its enabling legislation. This provision allows the Endowment to work in partnership with private and other non-federal sources of funding for the arts. Designed to encourage and stimulate increased private funding for the arts, the Treasury Fund allows non-federal contributors to join the Endowment in the grantmaking process, generally for projects supported by the Endowment under the established program guidelines.

The Endowment encourages use of the Treasury Fund method as an especially effective way of combining federal and private support, and as an encouragement to all potential donors, particularly those representing new or substantially increased sources of funds.

The Endowment may accept gifts in the form of money and other property. Bequests may be made to the Endowment as well. Gifts to the Endowment are generally deductible for federal income, estate, and gift tax purposes.

Gifts may be made to the Endowment for the support of a nonprofit, tax-exempt, cultural organization which has been notified that the Endowment intends to award it a grant under its regular program guidelines—organizations such as a museum, a symphony orchestra, a dance, opera, or theatre company—or for an Endowment program, such as fellowships, touring, conferences, or workshops.

When a restricted gift is received it frees an equal amount from the Treasury Fund, which is then made available to the grantee in accordance with the amount and conditions of the grant, as recommended by the National Council on the Arts and approved by the Chairman.

The Endowment also accepts unrestricted gifts to be used for projects recommended to the Chairman by the National Council on the Arts.
