

Requirements for Acknowledgement of NEA Support

Partnership Agreement Grants

1. **Requirements for State Arts Agencies (SAAs) and Regional Arts Organizations (RAOs).**

SAAs and RAOs must clearly acknowledge support from the National Endowment for the Arts in their programs and related promotional materials for the life of the grant period.

(A) Print and Web. The following examples are included as models for print and Web acknowledgement. They may be utilized as is or segments from more than one example may be combined as appropriate for your circumstances:

- *This project is supported in part by an award from the National Endowment for the Arts.*
- *Funding for the _____ Arts Commission and its programs is provided by the State of _____ and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.*
- *The _____ Arts Commission is funded by the _____ State Legislature, other public and private sources, and the National Endowment for the Arts.*

(B) Official Logo. In addition, SAAs and RAOs are encouraged to incorporate the current NEA logo into their agency's publications and Web site along with the acknowledgement of NEA support. You may download the current NEA logo from our Web site at <https://www.arts.gov/grants/manage-your-award>.

(C) Radio, Television, and Streaming Audio and/or Video Broadcast. For television broadcast, display of the current NEA logo is required. For all, following language is required:

- *This project is supported in part by an award from the National Endowment for the Arts.*

2. **Requirements for All Organizations Receiving Awards from SAAs and RAOs.**

SAAs and RAOs should do all they can to make sure their grantees (subrecipients) recognize the role of the NEA in the programs that were assisted by NEA support. This helps to promote a more complete understanding of the federal role in supporting the arts in each state and region.

In order to prevent inappropriate crediting, SAAs and RAOs should clarify for their subrecipients that NEA crediting language should specify the supported program/activity, when relevant, and that they must remove NEA acknowledgements from their Web sites and printed materials at the completion of their respective grant period of performances.

(A) Print and Web. The following examples are included as models for print and Web acknowledgement. They may be utilized as is or segments from each may be combined as appropriate for your agency's circumstances.

- For project-based support:
 - *This project was supported [in part] by the _____ Arts Commission, which receives support from the State of _____ and the National Endowment for the Arts.*

- *This project was supported [in part] by the _____ Arts Commission, which receives support from the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.*
- For general operating support:
 - *[Name of organization] is supported [in part] by the _____ Arts Commission, which receives support from the State of _____ and the National Endowment for the Arts.*
 - *[Name of organization] is supported [in part] by the _____ Arts Commission, which receives support from the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.*

(B) Official Logo. In addition, recipients of SAA and RAO grants may display the current NEA logo www.arts.gov/manageaward/index.html with the crediting language (as noted above) for the duration of the grant period (period of performance) only.

(C) Radio, Television, and Streaming Audio and/or Video Broadcast. For television broadcast, display of the current NEA logo is required. For all, the following language is required:

- *This project is supported in part by an award from the National Endowment for the Arts.*
